



2006 PINOT NOIR “777” ROSELLA’S VINEYARD SANTA LUCIA HIGHLANDS

This limited production bottling from Rosella’s Vineyard in Monterey County is characterized by its remarkable freshness, finesse and purity of fruit. Plush berry and alluring spice flavors mingle on the palate with velvet-smooth tannins on the long finish. Originally from Morey St. Denis in the Burgundy region of France, this specific variety within the Pinot Noir family, or clone called “777” is a Dijon selection that emphasizes complexity in Pinot Noir.
